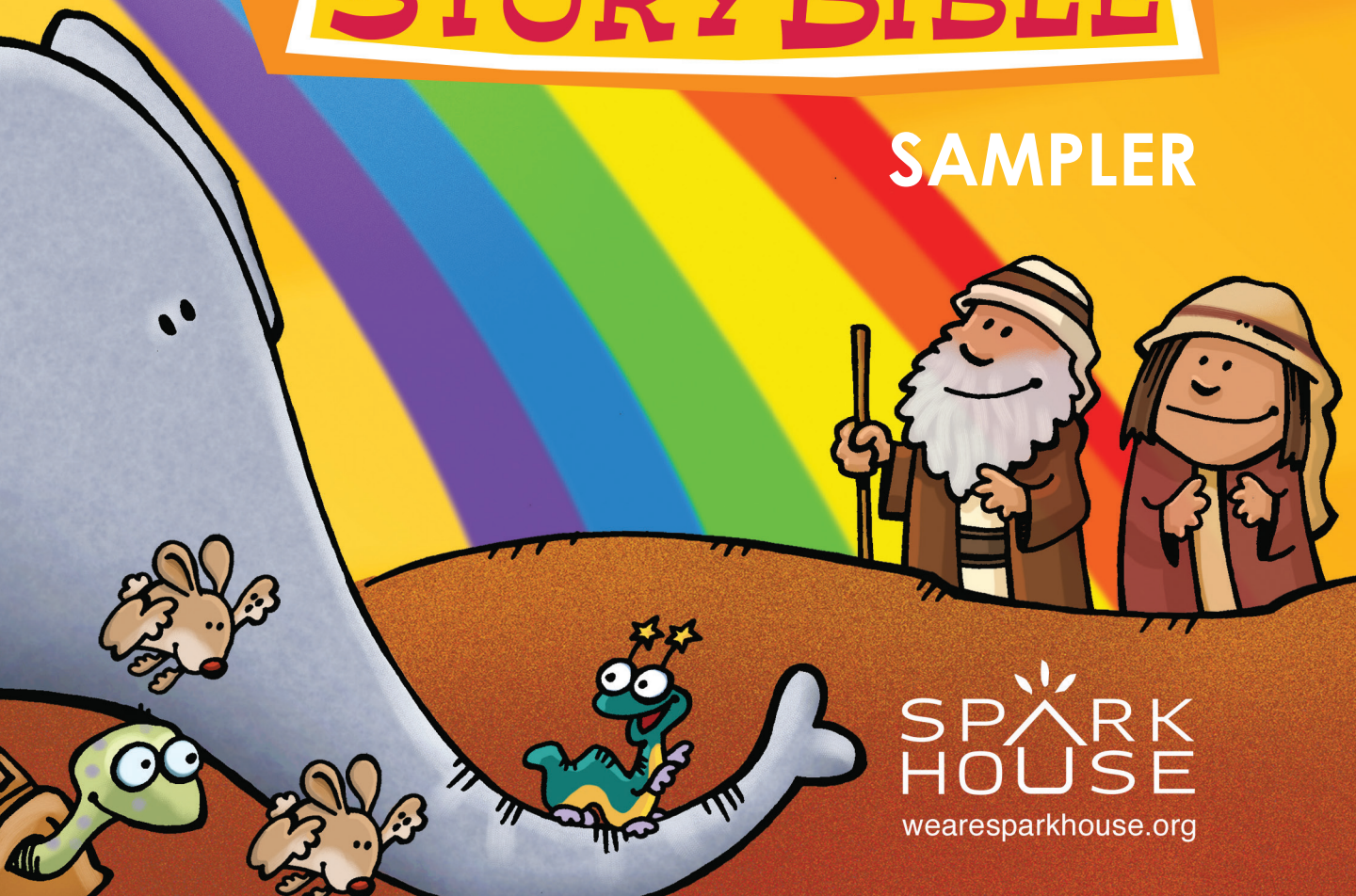

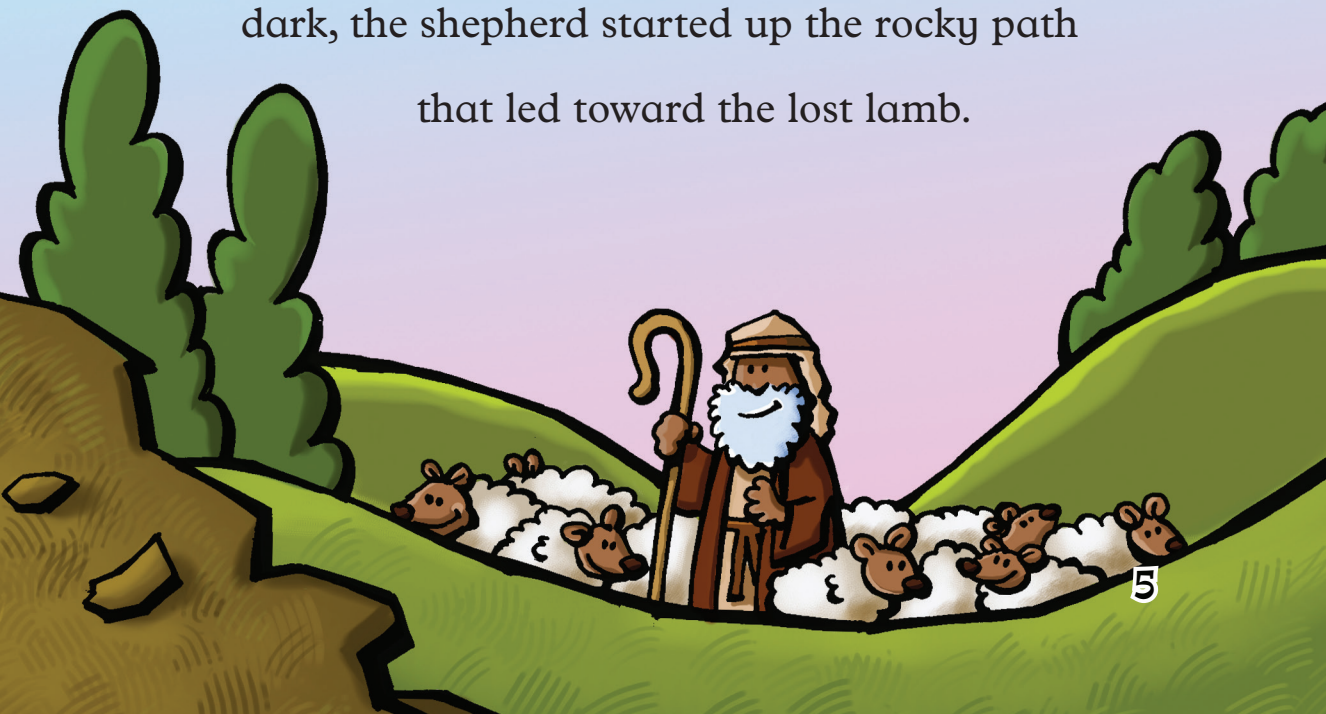
The little lamb was lost. “Ba-a-a!” said the little lamb. “Ba-a-a-a!” The sun slowly slid out of sight.
