The ten contributions in this volume (one previously published) aim to help contemporary, first-world readers of biblical texts develop a field of vision that sees and hears those who hunger, both those in the texts and those in the world today. After the editors' fifteen-page introduction, essays of interest to NT studies include those by K. M. O'Connor on biblical studies and a hermeneutic of hunger (2010); B. C. Gregory on social and theological aspects of hunger in Sirach; M. A. Beavis on "you give them something to eat" (Mk 6:37)—beyond a hermeneutic of hunger; L. Maloney on the friend at midnight (Lk 11:1-10); S. M. Elliott on an empty jar and a starving woman—*Gospel of Thomas* 97 and a hermeneutics of hunger; M. S. Ibita on including the hungry *adelphoi*—Pauline points of view in 1 Cor 11:17-34; and McGinn and M. T. Wilson-Reitz on
